## Quick and Handy Grammar Review: Prepositions

You are probably not surprised to learn that many professors consider prepositions to be the most difficult part of speech to use. Why? Because they are always abstract. You can't see, feel, taste, smell, or hear prepositions. That is because they express relationships between or among things, but they do not express or describe things themselves.

The following is a list of common prepositions, some notes on their use, and examples.

Preposition	Notes	Examples
About	Meanings: on (the subject of) and around (a place)	I read a book <b>about</b> the war. The speech was <b>about</b> causes of cancer. You can now move freely <b>about</b> the cabin.
Above	Meaning: on top of	I placed the painting <b>above</b> the table. The blue sky was <b>above</b> us all afternoon.
Across	Meaning: on the other side	The theater is <b>across</b> the street from the bank. Columbus traveled <b>across</b> the ocean in 1492.
After	Meaning: later in time	<b>After</b> the game, the players went to dinner. <b>After</b> lunch, I studied in the library. The students were very tired <b>after</b> the exam.
Against	Meanings: opposed to and in contact with	Mr. Jones ran <b>against</b> Ms. Adams for treasurer. The umbrella is leaning <b>against</b> the wall.
Along	Meaning: on the side of	We strolled <b>along</b> the bank of the river. There are many hotels <b>along</b> the Danube.
Among	Meaning: in the midst of	There is a cat sitting <b>among</b> the flowers. He was found <b>among</b> the dead after the battle.
Around	Meanings: in a circle and turning a corner	The teacher walked <b>around</b> the room. Ken lives <b>around</b> the block.
At	Meanings: to state time and to state a place	The game starts <b>at</b> 9:00. Maya studies <b>at</b> the University of Nebraska. Leslie works <b>at</b> Apple Computers.
Before	Meaning: earlier in time	<b>Before</b> breakfast, I took a walk. I would like to finish <b>before</b> noon. The movie ended <b>before</b> 10:00.

## Prepositional Phrases

One of the most common constructions in the English language is the prepositional phrase. You can find prepositional phrases in almost every sentence. Sometimes there are even two or three prepositional phrases used in the same sentence.

The basic prepositional phrase has three words: preposition, article, noun. This is the most common construction. Other words, such as adjectives, may be added. The article is not used in some phrases, and the noun may be replaced by a pronoun. Analyze the following examples:

In the closet (preposition, article, noun)

Over the chair (preposition, article, noun)

To the woman (preposition, article, noun)

From the mall (preposition, article, noun)

To India (preposition, noun)

Near Syria (preposition, noun)

After lunch (preposition, noun)

Toward me (preposition, pronoun)

With them (preposition, pronoun)

**Spelling Note:** This lesson shows the American spelling of the words *Theater* (p. 2), *Traveled* (p. 2 & 7), and *Canceled* (p. 12). Most other English-speaking countries spell these words this way: *Theatre*, *Travelled*, and *Cancelled*. Make it a challenge for your students to find these words in the text and see if they know the alternate spellings.

**Editor's Note: Preposition or Adverb?** Some words in English such as *up*, *down*, *on*, *off*, etc. can function as prepositions or adverbs depending on sentence position and function.
